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1. **apt / aptly** Adj. (apt) / Adverb (aptly) Extremely appropriate, suitable, or fitting for the circumstances. (Can also mean having a natural tendency or being quick to learn). Example: *"The band's name was an apt description of their chaotic style."* / *"She aptly summarized the complex issue in just a few sentences."*
2. **append** V. To add something as an attachment, supplement, or afterthought to the end of a document or speech. Example: *"The lawyer decided to append a list of conditions to the final contract."* **appendage** (n)
3. **automaton** N. A moving mechanical device made in imitation of a human being; a robot. Figuratively, it refers to a person who acts mechanically without a soul or thoughts. Example: *"After working sixteen hours straight, he felt like a mere automaton repeating the same motions."*
4. **aver** V. To state, assert, or declare something firmly and positively as a fact. Example: *"Despite the intense questioning, the witness continued to aver that she was telling the absolute truth."*
5. **auspices** N. With the help, support, guidance, or endorsement of a specific person or organization (usually used in the phrase "under the auspices of"). Example: *"The Covid research project was funded and conducted under the auspices of the World Health Organization."*
6. **assuage** V. To make an unpleasant or painful feeling less intense; to satisfy or appease an appetite or desire. Example: *"A warm cup of tea helped to assuage his anxiety before the big presentation."*
7. **austere** Adj. Severe, strict, or uncompromising in manner or attitude; having no comforts or luxuries (bare, simple, or plain). Example: *"The monk lived a quiet, austere life in a small concrete cell with only a bed and a desk."* **austerity** n. He chose to live a life of monastic **austerity**. Life in a dungeon during the Middle Ages was abject **austerity**.
8. **au courant** oh-koo-RAHN Adj. Well-informed, up-to-date, or fully aware of the latest news, trends, or developments. Example: *"As a tech journalist, she makes sure to stay au courant with the newest smartphone advancements."*
9. **arbitrage** N. (can also be used as a verb) Definition: The simultaneous buying and selling of the same asset or commodity in different markets to take advantage of differing prices and make a profit. Example: *"By buying the stock cheap in London and selling it instantly for more in New York, the trader made a fortune through arbitrage."*
10. **aseptic** Adj. Free from contamination caused by harmful bacteria, viruses, or other microorganisms; surgically sterile. Example: *"Surgeons must work in an aseptic environment to prevent infections during surgery."*
11. **askew** Adj. or Adv. Not straight, level, or aligned; crooked or to one side. Example: *"The gust of wind blew his hat askew and left the framed pictures on the wall tilting sideways."*
12. **asperity** N. Harshness, sharpness, or severity of tone, temper, or manner; it can also refer to a rough edge or surface irregularity. Example: *"The manager's voice took on a sudden asperity when she realized the deadlines had been missed."*
