1. **intumulate** (in-TOO-muh-late) v To bury; to place in a grave. *The ancient king was intumulated in a magnificent tomb.*
2. **invective** (in-VEK-tiv) n Abusive, insulting, or highly critical language. *The politician's speech was filled with invective against his opponents.*
3. **inveigh** (in-VAY) v To speak or write angrily and forcefully against something or someone. *The teacher inveighed against the students' careless behavior.*
4. **inveigle** (in-VAY-gul) v To persuade or trick someone into doing something, usually through clever or flattering talk. *He inveigled his brother into lending him the car.* synonym: beguile
5. **invidious** (in-vid-i-ous) adj Likely to cause resentment, jealousy, or anger; unfairly discriminatory. Comparing someone to someone else to make that person look bad. *She was placed in the invidious position of having to choose between two close friends.*
6. **invigilate** (in-VIJ-uh-late) v To supervise students during an examination. *The professor was asked to invigilate the final examination.*
7. **irascible** (ih-RASS-uh-bul) adj Easily angered; having a quick temper. *The irascible old man became angry whenever the neighbors made noise.*
8. **irrefragable** (ih-REF-ruh-guh-bul) adj Impossible to refute, dispute, or disprove; undeniable. *The detective presented irrefragable evidence of the suspect's guilt.*
9. **irremeable** (ir-REE-mee-uh-bul) adj From which there is no return; unable to be traveled back. *The explorers entered an irremeable passage deep beneath the mountain.*
10. **irremediable** (ir-ih-MEE-dee-uh-bul) adj Impossible to repair, correct, or cure. *The damage to the ancient manuscript was irremediable.*
11. **jape** (JAYP) n, v Definition: n: A joke or playful trick. v: To joke, tease, or make fun of. **japing, japed, japer.** Noun: *His harmless jape made everyone laugh.* Verb: *The boys japed with each other during lunch.*
12. **jejune** (jih-JOON) adj Naive, immature, or lacking intellectual depth; also, dull or simplistic. *The critic dismissed the movie as a jejune attempt at serious drama.*
